CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order at 7:34pm.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

D. Harmon motioned to accept the public minutes for the commission meeting on March 10th, 2022, T. Hardy second, motioned passed 5-0-0.

ORDER OF BUSINESS

Law Property

M. Post states that the owners are interested in conservation and agriculture. Owners would like to see wildlife preservation, hiking trails, etc., and are interested in agriculture as well. Suggests Ag Comm works with conservation to help determine potential uses, if deemed appropriate. T. Dufresne states he would work with Cheryl would reach out to the Owners once they are back in town, and stated a lease would be an appropriate instrument. T. Hardy stated that it there may be wetlands considerations as designated on the NRPC map, and that it would need to be continually farmed to ensure it remains in its current status.

Stefanowicz Property

Forest Management Plan: This is a Conservation commission agenda item, and T. Dufresne suggested that the forest management be actively monitored by the Ag Comm, in consultation with the Conservation Comm. Lessee states the forest management plan is a 25 year term, and one portion of this has already been funded. Additionally, Lessee has to file intent to cut and the Town needs to file a timber harvest tax waiver. M. Post states there needs to be a formal document of understanding to ensure communications between the two commissions to ensure coordination. D. Harmon queried what the monitoring duties would entail. Lessee states that over the 25 year year plan there would be a report generated to ensure outlining details or requirements. Lessee states posting of no trespassing due to logging needs to be displayed during logging operations.
