16 **MEETING**

1. Town Election

Chairman Le Doux announced that the Town Election will be Tuesday, March 8, 2016 from 7:00 AM to
7:00 PM at the Lawrence Barn. The Town Meeting will be Saturday, March 12, 2016 starting at 10:00
AM.

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2. Introduction of Joseph Hoebeke

Chief Jay Sartell introduced Joseph Hoebeke to the Board of Selectmen. Mr. Hoebeke spoke about his
 education, experience and qualifications in law enforcement and the Board spoke about the community of
 Hollis.

MOVED by Vahrij Manoukian, seconded by David Petry that the Selectmen approve the recommendation from Chief Sartell to hire Joseph Hoebeke as a Lieutenant for the Hollis Police Department. Voting in favor of the motion were Le Doux, Petry, Manoukian, and Band. No one was opposed. The motion PASSED 4-0-0.

Chief Sartell informed the Board of the accreditation, training and hiring process for the Hollis Police Department. Chief Sartell spoke about the department vehicles, including funding for replacement vehicles. There are currently 6 vehicles in the fleet. One of which was in a motor vehicle accident and is currently unusable. Two new bicycles were purchased last year and Chief Sartell is planning on bringing them out this spring to be utilized.

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3. Farley Building

Chairman Le Doux stated that he recently met with Andy Corey, School Superintendent, to discuss the Farley Building. The original study has been reviewed and whether the building will be a multi-purpose facility that could house the seniors, the SAU administration and/or classroom setting, the intended purpose of the building still needs to be determined. The question regarding title ownership for the building was deliberated. It was questioned whether the title should be transferred to the Hollis School

44 Board, since they are the landlord of the SAU, or if it should remain with the Town of Hollis.

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46 Selectman Petry would prefer that it stays with the Town and not transfer it to the School Board. He

- 47 expressed some concern with property/lot lines being inaccurate.
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49 Selectman Manoukian agreed with Selectman Petry and would like to utilize the building for the seniors,

- 50 town elections, meeting spaces, and potential office space. He also noted that the parking is sufficient and
- 51 should not be an issue. He would like to keep the building with the town and reconstruct it. Chairman Le
- 52 Doux stated that Mr. Richard Stahl, private donor, would not be interested in tearing the building down
- 53 for reconstruction and therefore would not contribute the funds.

55 Selectman Band was in favor of transferring the title and land to the School Board, stating that he felt they 56 could make the best and most use out of the building. He felt the property line issue could be rectified

- and would like to implement a plan for the facility. He doesn't feel tearing it down would be an
- 58 acceptable option.
- 59

60 Chairman Le Doux indicated that he would like to see more facts. He stated that the idea of rehabilitating

- 61 the building with private money made sense and that others in the community have expressed their
- 62 support for that endeavor. He would prefer to oversee the project from a financial and engineering

63 standpoint and potentially transition the building over to the school for administrative purposes.

- 64 Chairman Le Doux would like to include input from Selectman Cadwell in the discussion.
- 65

66 Discussion took place about a possible compost facility in Pepperell, MA which could possibly impact

67 the abutting property owners. The residents were concerned about the odor and questioned why they

hadn't been notified of the situation. Selectman Petry requested a memo from Mark Fougere, Town

69 Planner, detailing the situation and determining which residents would be impacted. Kim Galipeau,

- 70 Town Administrator, was directed to contact Nashua Regional Planning Commission (NRPC) to see if
- they were aware of the situation.

73 NEW/OLD BUSINESS

1. Town Meeting/Warrant Article Discussion

Chairman Le Doux reviewed the itinerary for the Town Meeting and spoke about the purpose of the land
 articles, including the financial details of the interest and bonds for each of the properties. The Board
 determined which Selectmen will present each warrant article.

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Mike Rattin of Faith Baptist Church, inquired about whether the Selectmen had a priority list for the land articles. Chairman Le Doux stated that the Budget Committee did not support all of the proposed articles for their own reasons. The Board of Selectmen felt that the citizens should vote on the articles and therefore recommended that all of the properties by included on the ballot for Town Meeting. Chairman Le Doux commented that the Land Protection Study Committee and Conservation Commission did an exemplary job presenting the properties to the Board.

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86 Mr. Rattin asked about the tax impact for the citizens. Chairman Le Doux stated, if only Birch Hill

87 Properties was purchased, the total tax impact in 15 years for a \$400,000 house would be \$895.00. If

88 only Rocky Pond Properties was purchased, the total tax impact would be \$1,015. If only Stefanowicz

89 Properties was purchased, the total tax impact would also be \$1,015. If all three proposed properties were

- purchased, the average cost for year one would be \$195 or \$29,025 over the life of 15 years. Chairman
 Le Doux commented that the tax rate would decrease in 2018 and 2019 when the school and other facility
- bonds are paid off. There are no significant bonds forecasted for the next several years from any of the
- 92 entities, besides fixing the roof on the High School in approximately 4-5 years. Chairman Le Doux also

94 commented that the overall tax rate is going up 0.3% each year for the Town of Hollis.

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97		electman Manoukian announced the he attended the Volunteer Breakfast along with Selectman Band						
98	this past Saturday at the Lawrence Barn. The event was well attended and went great. It was noted that							
99	next year will mark the 10 th anniversary of the celebration.

101		Selectman Manoukian spoke about the heroin and drug epidemic in our communities, stating that there						
102	were 420 deaths statewide last year, which has doubled from the previous year. Selectman Manoukian is							
103	part of a panel of industry professionals that participate in community discussions around the state,							
104	addressing the epidemic. He would like to be more proactive in this community and encouraged the							
105	board to continue working through the legislation process to form stricter, regulated guidelines. He							
106	invited the board to attend the Hollis Brookline Rotary Club meeting to hear his presentation.
