COMMITTEE AND BOARD UPDATES

Planning Board Update - B. Moseley

B. Moseley shared 4 cases:

1. Silver Lake Road Development - B. Moseley shared that the Planning Board (PB) commenced a site walk on Silver Lake Road where the old Flea Market was held and noted that there was a fair amount of trash throughout, but the most concerning was the trash that was pushed into the Wetlands area. B. Moseley noted that the PB has made it clear that this is something that needs to be dealt with promptly by the applicant. He also shared that the application has five single family homes planned for that section of land. B. Moseley made note of the public's complaint that the driveway to this development would be directing the traffic's headlights into their house. The applicant amended the driveway to accommodate this complaint.

Discussion took place on the kind of debris that was on site, and whether or not the Fish and Game services were notified.

- B. Moseley shared that the PB voted to send the application into the final stages, and that the applicant would be back in the next couple months to finalize the application.
- T. Davies asked the size of the site and if the wetlands were included in that acreage.
- B. Moseley responded that the site was approximately 18.43 acres and that the wetlands were included in the acreage.
- T. Davies asked if the development would be a HOSPD.
- B. Mosley replied no, and that it would be a minor subdevelopment with their own cistern.
- P. Armstrong asked for clarification on whether or not this would be in the category of a minor or major subdivision.
- B. Mosley replied that it is a minor subdivision, but as it is on a main town road, they have to adhere to the major subdividing rules as well.
- 2. Lorenzos Lane Development B. Moseley shared that the PB approved the application, as the applicant had fulfilled all the state requirements.
- 3. Scenic Road Hearing B. Moseley shared that the PB granted David Sullivan permission to cut down several dead trees along Worcester Road.
- 4. Ground Mount Solar 89 Pepperell Road B. Moseley shared that the PB decided a site walk was unnecessary, as the ground mounted solar paneling was non-visible from the road. The PB approved the application on the condition that they would maintain the appropriate buffer in perpetuity so that the panels would not be seen by abutters or the road.
