On November 25, 2023 at approximately 11:00 PM, a Hollis patrol officer was fueling his cruiser at Hollis Auto on Ash St, when he observed a vehicle traveling eastbound at a high rate of speed and with non functioning tail lights. A motor vehicle stop was initiated on Broad St. The operator was identified as Jennifer Yeam, 38, of Nashua. While speaking with Yeam, officers detected signs of impairment . After a road side investigation, Yeam was arrested and transported to the Hollis Police Department where she was processed and released on PR bail with an arraignment date scheduled at the 9th Circuit Court, Nashua District. She is charged with Aggravated DUI, as a result of having a BrAC of .16, which is double the statutory limit of .08.

On November 26, 2023 at aprximately 1:30 AM, another officer was traveling on Broad St when he observed a vehicle traveling westbound. This vehicle crossed the double solid yellow line, at which point the officer initiated a motor vehicle stop. The driver was identified as Crystal Franciosi, 49, of Hollis. During a roadside investigation, the officer developed probable cause to believe that Franciosi was under the influence of alcohol. She was arrested and transported to the Hollis Police Department where she was processed and released on PR bail with an arraignment date scheduled at the 9th Circuit Court, Nashua District. She is charged with DUI and a yellow line violation.

This message, which was published just a few days ago, bears repeating:

As the 2023 Holiday season gets under way, the Hollis Police Department wishes to remind the community that impaired driving will not be tolerated and those who choose to drive while under the influence will be held accountable for their dangerous decisions.
