


HOLLIS POLICE DEPARTMENT Police Trading Cards Contest

(Available to Hollis Children, Ages 12 and Under)



About the Program

We are now pleased to announce the arrival of the Second Edition of the Hollis Police Department Trading Cards. Through a generous donation/funding by the Hollis Police Department Benevolent Association (HPBA), we are able to provide the children of Hollis with the opportunity to collect all 20 cards, but most importantly, by participating in this contest, the children of this community will have the chance to interact with the men and women of the Hollis Police Department in a personal and positive manner.

How to Collect Hollis Police Trading Cards (Second Edition)

Children in Kindergarten, as well as the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th grades may collect the current edition of the Hollis Police Department Trading Cards by approaching any officer or employee, by writing an individual officer/employee a letter, or by coming into the Hollis Police Station and requesting to see the officer/employee. Participants will also have the opportunity to meet some of the police staff as they visit the schools and interact with the students. Cards of officers and employees will also available at the Police Booth at Old Home Days on September 15th. Availability of cards will be limited to only those employees in attendance. Additionally, some cards will be made available at the Hollis Communications Center and any other police department sponsored events.

PRIZES

The first student from Kindergarten and 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th grades who collect the complete edition (20 cards) will be invited to attend a "pizza party" with Chief Joseph Hoebeke and members of the Hollis Police Department. Parents of the lucky students will also be invited to attend this party, which will be held at either the Hollis Police Department or Lawrence Barn at a date to be determined.

THE CONTEST WILL BEGIN ON FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2018, and will continue until the first student from each of the participating grades have been identified.

CONTEST RULES

- This contest is open to all Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th grade students with the Town of Hollis School District. The contest is also open to students in the above grade groups who attend the Montessori School as well as those who are home schooled.
- Regardless of the contest guidelines, we encourage all students of all ages to participate in the collection of cards and the furtherance of interaction with the members of the Hollis Police Department.
- All participating students should refer to the Hollis Police Department Trading Card poster, which will display all 20 cards in the edition. Copies of posters will be displayed in the lobby of the Hollis Police Department, the Hollis Primary School, and the Hollis Upper Elementary School. Students and parents can also view an image of poster by visiting the Hollis Police Department website at http://hollisnh.org/police/

- After a student has collected a complete set, they must bring all twenty cards to a teacher within their respective school, or present the cards to Officer Bergeron. Cards may be presented to a teacher or the Officer Bergeron when they first arrive at school in the morning during their homeroom session. Ultimately, Officer Bergeron will be responsible for reviewing the collection to ensure that the student has collected the complete edition.
- IN ORDER TO REDUCE DISTRACTION, STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO BRING COP CARDS TO SCHOOL UNLESS THEY ARE DOING SO IN ORDER TO GAIN VERIFICATION THAT THEY HAVE COLLECTED ALL 20 CARDS. TRADING OF COP CARDS IS NOT PERMITTED AT SCHOOL OR ON SCHOOL BUSES.
- The first student from Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th grades who collect the complete edition (20 cards) will be invited to attend a pizza party with Chief Joseph Hoebeke and members of his staff. Parents of the lucky students will also be invited to attend this party, which will be held at the Hollis Police Department or the Lawrence Barn at a date to be determined.
- Children of Hollis Police Department employees are not eligible to win the contest; however, participation in collecting all 20 cards is permitted.
- **THE CONTEST WILL BEGIN ON FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2018,** and will continue until the first student from each of the participating grades have been identified.

CONTEST GUIDELINES

With the participation in this special program, there will be situations when the collection of trading cards may be inappropriate. These are some guidelines for those situations that should be followed to avoid problems.

- DO Try to collect the entire set of the Second Edition of the Hollis Police Department Trading Cards.
- DO Trade cards with your classmates and friends so that you can complete your set. Just remember that cards are not

•			for police officers while they are on patrol, wave to , and ask them for one of their "Trading Cards".

•	DO	Acquire individual police officers' cards at the Hollis Police Department, or by writing to a Hollis Police Officer or employee.	
•	DON'I	[Break classroom rules and approach officers while you are in your class lines while moving between classes and activities.
•	DON'1	ſ	Bring your cards to school or on the bus unless you are presenting them to a teacher or Officer Bergeron to show that you have collected all 20 cards.
•	DON'T	Γ	Ask an officer if they are busy with a car stop or conducting an investigation.
•	DON'T		Run into the street after an officer to get a Trading Card. Wave to get the officers attention, and if they are not busy, they will try to get a card to you.
•	DON'I	[Forget your manners, such as saying "Please" and "Thank You" when asking for a card and receiving one.
•	DON'I	[Forget to have a good time collecting your cards.
